


**RAISING ANGORA GOATS FOR BEAUTIFUL MOHAIR**


### **WORKING WOOL IN THE WEST**

## **RUMINATIONS OF A GRUMPY SHEPHERD**



# **Temple Grandin's Guide to Working with Farm Animals: Safe, Humane Livestock Handling Practices for the Small Farm**





The book is a detailed tutorial describing the techniques needed to create an heirloom braided rug. The book is divided into 5 Parts. The first part is a discussion of wool and its characteristics. The second part deals with selecting the fiber, how to wash it, how to choose the colors, and basic equipment needed. The 3<sup>rd</sup> part discusses the technique of braiding. Part 4 deals with the rug itself and the variety of shapes that can be created. There are tips and techniques and a thorough description of how to care for the rug. Part 5 discusses breeds of sheep and the wool they produce. The book is well-written and the easy to follow directions insure success.

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
